Speaking of "popping", the music was popping and the dance floor was hopping. Bob Woods brought his



JUDY KLOTZER-HAYES

Inducted October 7, 2018

Judy's musical career began as a student at the Oahu Conservatory of Music, with her parents' support and inspiration from her uncle. At the age of 13, she progressed from student to teacher. She taught Hawaiian guitar, ukulele, rhythm guitar, bass guitar and accordion for seven years. During this time, she also gained much playing experience at fairs, convention centers, various organizations, clubs and on the radio.

At the age of 20, Judy got married and, two years later, gave birth to her daughter, Lori. During this time, she continued teaching students and directing recitals.

In 1967, Judy worked for **Annie & the Orphans** as the bassist for eight years. In 1975, Judy became a free-lance bassist and worked with various groups, from trios to big bands. She was involved in studio recording and more radio during this time.

In 1983, Judy joined the Western Swing Society of Seattle and was newsletter editor for two years, a board member for two years and an alternate for three years. She has also served on various committees and performed at many of the showcases over the years. She was bassist for J.B. Parker & The Over The Hill Gang as well as Don Berkshire and the Bootleggers and many others during the Western Swing Society's early years. During her musical life, Judy has performed with many of the top names in the business. She continues to attend and play at major events in Sacramento, Seattle and Canada to promote the music she loves.



JACK LOYD

May 31, 1928-July 29, 1993 Inducted October 2, 1983

Jack Loyd was born in Clement, Oklahoma, the last of seven children born to Eugene and Florence Loyd. He was raised in a home with lots of music and singing. Jack's mother played piano and organ in church. His father was a square dance caller and dances were held in their home.

Jack's older brothers, Tbl on guitar and Lee on bass fiddle, played in bands around Hughson, California, in the late 1930s. When Jack was 16 years old, in 1944, his older brother Lee taught him how to play the bass fiddle.

The following year, he helped to form the first Western Swing band in northern California called the Sagebrush Serenaders. Jack was vocalist and played bass. They played live radio six days a week on KTRB Modesto, California, and played for dances throughout the valley and bay area for the next 4 years.

In 1949, Bob Wills requested Jack to come to Sacramento, and try out with the Texas Playboys. After about an hour of Jack being able to sing every song that Bob Wills asked him to sing, Jack was hired on the spot.

He was Bob's vocalist and bass fiddle player for the next 7 years. During this time, Jack recorded around 30 records and live show recordings with the Playboys. Jack wrote the song "I married the rose of San Antone" and recorded it with Wills and the band

After leaving the Wills band in 1956, Jack worked in the auto industry in Sacramento and would work as a guest singer in local bands. He passed away at 65 years old in 1983.

The biggest influence in my life was my father. He taught me how to be a good man and respect others. The quote I will always remember he said, "Jimmy, if you fail to plan, plan to fail."

R.I.P. Lou Bischoff



(Born January 25, 1930
Died May 29, 2019)
We never get used to losing people here at Western Swing but we have been getting hit kind of hard as it is an ageing society. This lady, Lou Bischoff was Western Swing Royalty. She supported everyone across the board that played, danced or just came to listen to western swing music. Because of that drive for the music she has been put in

our Hall of Fame. Here is her biography submitted in 2005.

Mayme Lou Bischoff was born on January 25, 1930 in Renton, Washington and passed away on May 29, 2019.

Born in Renton, WA, raised at Pine Lake, WA, Lou began playing the piano when she was nine. At the age of twelve, realizing classical music was not her thing, she switched teachers, started learning big band music, and joined a group who played for high school dances and events. During these years Lou also discovered country music.

Lou then married, and during the years she was raising her family "played only the radio". Later she entered the nursing profession, and through new friendships became exposed to western swing music Lou knew she had found her kind of music.

When the Seattle Western Swing Music Society was formed in 1983, Lou couldn't make the first sessions because of her weekend work schedule, but she kept up with the happenings through friends and newsletters. Later on she was able to be part of the Society's management and the organization of its events, including the annual Pioneers of Western Swing Hall of Fame Music Festival. Lou has served as President of the Society for the last several years.

At Lou's first POWS (Pioneers of Western Swing Festival) in 1993, she was asked to be a hostess. There she met Truitt Cunningham, Dean McKinney Moore, Bobby Koefer and Smokey Rogers, the "Idols" she had heard so much about. The following year, Lou was elected Secretary of the Seattle West-


Album: Ridin' Ropin' &

ented musicians, all heard on vocal. Tex Hamel plays acoustic and lap steel guitar. Miz Patti Hamel is heard playing accordion and



ern Swing Music Society. She held that office or that of board member until she was elected President in 2001. She held the office of President through 2008. After a brief absence, Lou joined the Board again in 2012, retiring in 2018.

In 1994 she and her husband Ed became dance and life partners. In addition to their ongoing work and promotion of western swing through the Seattle Society, they have traveled extensively to participate in western swing events throughout the country. On one of their trips to Oklahoma, she helped provide the inspiration and support for the formation of the largest western swing music society of them all, the Western Swing Music Society of the Southwest.

Lou has been honored with many awards over the years, including the NWWSMS' Steve Vaughn Founder's Award in 1998. In 2005, Lou was honored to be inducted into the Kaqnsas Western Swing Music Society Hall of Fame as well as Seattle's Western Swing Music Society (now the NWWSMS) and the Western Swing Society in Sacramento.

Lou is survived by her devoted husband, Ed, and an incredible community of family and friends. A Celebration of Life was held on June 29, 2019 at the Pine Lake Community Club in Sammamish, WA. After the scheduled program, musicians shared their music and memories that will keep Lou alive forever in our hearts. The family hopes that peace and healing will be found through the music that Lou helped immortalize.
