#### **BOB ROHAN**

Inducted October 6, 2024



Bob Rohan or as he is known in Texas as "Bad Bob" has been playing the fiddle and singing in various groups for over 30 years in Texas, and has opened for Merle Haggard, Willie Nelson, Charlie Daniels, Carlene Carter and John Conley to name a few.

Bob has played in bands that have backed up country legends like Hank Thompson, Ray Price, Jack Greene, Pam Tillis, and Dale Watson.

His first album "Bad Bob" recorded in 1983 was well-received in Texas and his version of "Orange Blossom Special" was a favorite at country night-clubs and discos in the Houston area.

Bob's new CD "Bad Bob and his Good Friends" has been played a great deal in the United States and Europe and his traditional swing style has been popular in Holland, Australia, England, Belgium, Germany and recently Spain!

Bob is also a gifted songwriter and wrote nine songs on his recent CD. Along with songwriting, Bob is an also a talented cartoonist has a self syndicated comic strip titled "Buffalo Gals". The comic feature is about two cowgirls "Bess Winchester" and "Connie Cheyenne". The comic strip was inspired after playing with "The Hays County Gals and Pals" a cowgirl western group that toured through Texas, Oklahoma and as far west as Elko, Nevada.

Bob has won The Wisconsin State Fiddle Championship and has been nominated several times from The Academy of Western Artists for Best Cowboy Cartoonist.



#### HOWARD CHARLES EDWARDS

Born September 22, 1923 Died October 23, 2016 Inducted October 6, 2002



Howard was born September 22, 1933 in Virginia City, Nevada, where his father worked in the silver mines. He was first introduced to music by his mother who played honky-tonk piano while he accompanied her on the guitar and mandolin. They spent many hours together.

His first music jobs were playing guitar in the 16 piece swing

bands of Jim Ingram and Russ Holiday in the bay area. In 1957 he started playing western swing and country in a club in Alameda, CA with Vern Baughman, a member of the Western Swing Society Hall of Fame. He then joined Bobby Thompson's trio playing bass at the Garden Inn in Hayward, CA. He played the Garden Inn nightclub for 23 years.

In 1958 Howard was hired by Red Murell to play at Forester Hall in Redwood City, CA on Saturday nights. When Forester Hall closed, he was hired by Cottonseed Clark to play in his band for two TV shows every Saturday on KTVU Channel 2 in Oakland, CA and Saturday nights at Naperdack Hall in San Jose, CA. During the time he played with Red Murell and Cottonseed Clark he had the privilege of playing with many stars including; Ernest Tubb, Jimmy Dickens, George Jones, Tex Ritter Eddie Dean, Freddie Hary, Lefty Frizzell, Jimmy Wakely, Buck Owens, George Morgan, Merle Travis, Cal Smith, Carl Smith, Rose Maddox, Hank Snow, Joe Mafis, Webb Pierce, Merle Haggard, Wynn Stewart, Johnny Bond, Carl & Pearl Butler, Porter Wagonner, George Hamilton IV, and many others.

In 1960 he opened Guitar Village music store in Fremont, CA, teaching guitar and making and selling guitars. During this time he provided "Free Booking Service" to help provide the clubs in the area with country and western swing musicians. He also played bass and rhythm guitar on several recordings in the 1960's. He worked with many Bay Area musicians such as Bobby and Larry Black, Vern Baughman, Bobby Thompson, Gene Savage,

Jim Luttrell, Chuck Wayne, Vance Terry, Big Jim Danoon, Marty James, Bill Starr, Cal Smith, Max Wilson, Huck Fields, Leon Richardson, Red Hayes, Gene Duncan, Jimmy Rivers, Scotty Bray, Arveda Miller, Al Barle, Johnny Fain and many others.

In 1963 his band opened for the Grand Ole Opry at the Cow Palace in San Francisco. Howard played many of the popular clubs in the Bay Area including the Garden Inn, 1902 Club, Hitching Post, Top Hat, Cameo Club, Coral Club, Mustang Club, Standford University along with several San Francisco hotels and halls.

In 1970 Howard bought the Garden Inn. During the 10 years he owned and operated the club he employed many country and western swing musicians. Howard produced and played for over 400 swing dance contests at the club, promoting western swing music. Howard has been an ardent supporter of western swing music for over 45 years.

Howard and his wife Fran joined the Western Swing Society in 1992. They moved to Meadow Vista in 1995. Howard has many hobbies along with his music, he enjoys the outdoors and restoring vintage cars and musical instruments. He is also a private pilot and a member of the Civil Air Patrol and California Sheriffs Association and a licensed California Realtor.





This summer's shaping up to be one of the biggest in my Western Swing life, even if you haven't seen me around much. Between my son's 8th grade graduation, my daughter's Filipino cultural dancing, and keeping a band upright in this economy, I've been stretched thin in the best and wildest ways.

Life's been full. Rich. A little chaotic. I haven't had much time to pop in at the dances lately, but I've been working, quietly, steadily, and in motion.

In July, I'll be opening for Dale Watson in Santa Cruz (Moe's Alley.) A Texas legend that needs no introduction. One of the greats. Playing a show with someone like Dale is a reminder of why I keep doing this. That same month, my band, Mae McCoy and Her Neon

Stars, will take the stage at the California State Fair in Sacramento. We'll be carrying the sound of Western Swing into one of the state's biggest venues. It's a moment I don't take lightly.



In August, my dear friend Don Caldwell from Keepin' It Country is flying me out to Illinois to open for Mr. 'Keys in the Mailbox' himself, Tony Booth, another cornerstone in the music I love. Come December, I'll be presenting "A Nashville Christmas in Rancho Cordova," featuring The Farmer & Adele, one of Nashville's most charming and dedicated Western Swing bands. I'm also proud to say that Mae McCoy and Her Neon Stars will be backing them during their Northern California tour dates. There's something beautiful about being both the host and the music. That's the space I'm working in these days.

Western Swing is alive, well, and expanding, and there's room for all of us who find home in it. Every time we gather, whether to dance, play, or simply listen, we help continue a heritage rooted in joy, resilience, and culture.

I'm deeply grateful for the artists who came before us, musicians like Bob Wills, Cindy Walker, Milton Brown, Adolph Hofner, and Leon Rausch, who shaped the sound and spirit of Western Swing long before it ever reached a state fair stage or Spotify playlist. This music

wasn't built overnight. It was carried, stretched, refined, and passed down. I'm equally inspired by those keeping the flame alive today, including Billy Mata, Carolyn Martin, and California's own Poi Rogers, The Lucky Stars, and my band-crush for life, The Familiar Strangers. Every time I plug in a mic, I'm reminded that I belong to something bigger than myself. That awareness keeps me honest. It keeps me grateful.

If you see me this season, say hello. And if you're building something of your own, don't hesitate. The door's never been more open.

## HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS

#### THE TIMING

January 1—May 31st: Submissions of nominees for consideration accepted from a member in good standing

June: Hall of Fame Selection Committee reviews and chooses 12 nominees to be inducted in the Hall of Fame. Nominations must adhere to the rules and be complete in order to be considered. Any submissions not chosen roll forward to the next year for consideration

July: Board signs off on the chosen inductees. Inductees are notified and told about our Hall of Fame Event details

August: List of inductees first appear in the newsletter

September: Photos of inductees appear in newsletter. List of HOF bands in newsletter

October: The three day celebration, culminating in the Induction Ceremony on Sunday

#### **HOW TO AND THE RULES**

Let's have another inspiring set of inductees for the Western Swing Society Hall of Fame event, the 1st Friday—Sunday in October. The closing date for submission of nominations is May 31st. Start NOW. Time FLIES!

Any member in good standing may make 2 nominations, by either postal or email.

An 8 x 10 hard copy photo or a digital jpeg (at least res. 300 dpi) is <u>required</u> at the time of nomination.

The nomination should contain sufficient biographical information to enable the committee to evaluate the nominee's qualifications.

Nominations must include the name (as they wish it to appear in our Hall of Fame registry), address, phone numbers and email addresses (if available) for the nominee *and* the person submitting them. If the nominee is deceased, please include the name of a person who may be able to accept the award.
