Michael, a Sacramento native, has toured/recorded with multiple #1 artists in several genres including Steve Holy, Jo Dee Messina, Shane McAnally, SWV, Eric Benet, Roger Smith, Wayman Tisdale, Robert Brookins, Brent Bourgeois, and The Osmond Brothers. His first real

band experience came at age 14, playing with Buck Owens' cousin, Dale Owens, in the gospel group Joy. The band also provided Michael his first experience in a recording studio when the band made a record with Western Swing Society Hall of Fame member, Jimmy Baughman.

TV appearances include Tonight Show, David Letterman, Today Show, CNN's Entertainment This Week and five appearances on the Grand Ole Opry.

He has played on hundreds of artist CDs, TV show themes and national TV & radio ad campaigns. Michael returned to his hometown of Sacramento to marry his wife, Jenann, in 2018 after 20 years in Nashville and is currently playing with a host of local bands.

Through out the years Michael has been able to play western swing music on stage and on recordings whenever asked to. He also has been able to post his western swing capabilities on social media such as Youtube and Facebook.

We know Michael plays what pays the bills, but that doesn't limit his abilities. He is a truly great musician

MARTY JAMES

Born April 7, 1936 Died March 2, 2023 Inducted October 5, 1997



Born, with given name: Neal A. Maertins on April 7, 1936, in Richmond, California.

Early music training: Piano lessons at age four formal violin lessons beginning at age 9.

Concert violinist at age fourteen, performing on stage with the Richmond, Oakland

and San Francisco Symphonies at ages fifteen and sixteen.

Graduated from Richmond Union High School at seventeen, at which time was gaining clear interest in band music, performing as a member of local Glenn Miller style orchestras.


Entered the U.S. Air Force in early 1954 and upon being assigned to overseas duty in Tripoli, Lybia and North Africa was drawn to country and western bands and soon found himself with his own band playing in local service clubs. I was about this time that he teamed up Lucky Hill a local disc jockey. Lucky was responsible for coining his professional name, Marty James It was also at this time that he played on his first professional recording with Lucky on Starday Records.

Competed in All-Air Force talent shows with his western trio, winning at all levels, including the world championships in Las Vegas, Nevada in early 1956. From these performances his group was chosen to perform on the Ed Sullivan show. Soon after, he traveled with an all Air Force "Tops In Blue" variety show appearing in most of the eastern half of the U.S. As well as Iceland

While attending college in San Pablo, California he was hired by the Black Jack Wayne Band and per-

formed at the Garden of Allah in Niles, California as well as weekly TV show on channel 2 in Oakland, CA.

His musical interests concentrated on Western Swing and he joined the Al Palmer band in the later 60's. There he was fortu

nate to perform and fine tune his craft with musicians who had played with the Bob Wills and Leon McAuliff bands.

In the mid 60's he was chosen to perform with the Ray Price big band premiering his "For The Good Times" hit at the Hollywood Pavilion.

Later he played fiddle with the Shorty Joe's "Red Rock Canyon Band" in San Jose, CA area and joined Shorty's band for Western Swing cruise ship adventure in the Caribbean in 1992. Some of the outstanding musicians on that trip included Bobby and Larry Black.

Still performing regularly with Tom Rose and bobby Thompson bands throughout Northern CA.

Present home is in Livermore, California.

HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS

THE TIMING

January 1—May 31st: Submissions of nominees for consideration accepted from a member in good standing

June: Hall of Fame Selection Committee reviews and chooses 12 nominees to be inducted in the Hall of Fame. Nominations must adhere to the rules and be complete in order to be considered. Any submissions not chosen roll forward to the next year for consideration

July: Board signs off on the chosen inductees. Inductees are notified and told about our Hall of Fame Event details

August: List of inductees first appear in the newsletter

September: Photos of inductees appear in newsletter. List of HOF bands in newsletter

October: The three day celebration, culminating in the Induction Ceremony on Sunday

HOW TO AND THE RULES

Let's have another inspiring set of inductees for the Western Swing Society Hall of Fame event, the 1st Friday—Sunday in October. The closing date for submission of nominations is May 31st. Start NOW. Time FLIES!

Any member in good standing may make 2 nominations, by either postal or email.

An 8 x 10 hard copy photo or a digital jpeg (at least res. 300 dpi) is <u>required</u> at the time of nomination.

The nomination should contain sufficient biographical information to enable the committee to evaluate the nominee's qualifications.

Nominations must include the name (as they wish it to appear in our Hall of Fame registry), address, phone numbers and email addresses (if available) for the nominee *and* the person submitting them. If the nominee is deceased, please include the name of a person who may be able to accept the award.

Time is running out. May 31st is the last date to submit your nominations for our Hall of Fame celebration!

Being inducted into the Hall of Fame is a BIG HONOR, so submit a nomination and make someone's day!

- The name, address, phone and email of member submitting the nomination
- The name, address, phone and email of the nominee
- The nominee's name as the nominee wants it shown in the bio and on the Hall of Fame registry
- Biographical information about the nominee, with emphasis on involvement with Western Swing Music.
 - Birthplace and date.
 - Age at which participation in music began? How? Singing? Playing an instrument?
 - Early inspirations and influences?
 - Time and place of first professional performance
 - Name of well-known bands and/or performers with which nominee has played.
 - Names of well-known locations where nominee has performed.
 - List of any awards or formal recognitions received by the nominee related to his or her music career.
 - Nominee's personal reasons for involvement in and support of Western Swing Music.

See the instructions in the previous column and email or mail your completed nomination information so that it is received by WSS no later than May 31st.
